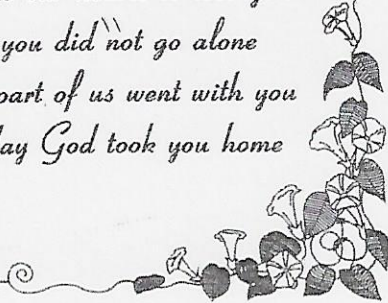


*"A Million Times"*

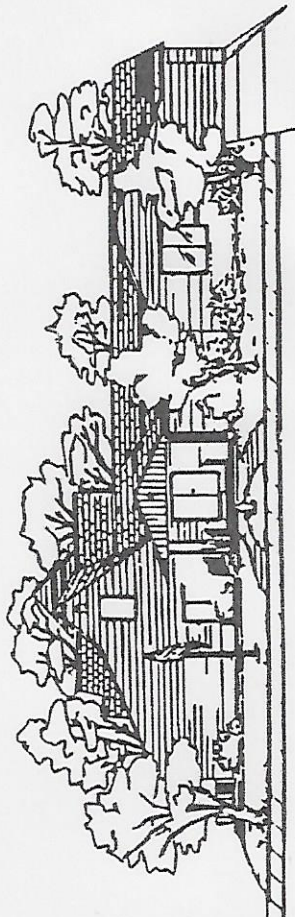
